## PRESIDENT CALLS SPECIAL SESSION

Word was received early yesterday morning via Guam that President Kennedy called the Security Council of the United Nations and the Organ of Consultation of the Organization of American States (OAS) into a special session. The President made a radio-television address yesterday explaining the reasons for calling these bodies into emergency meetings.

President Kennedy, in a special broadcast to the Nation at about 10:00 a.m. (Saipan time) yesterday morning, announced that a quarantine (blockade) was being imposed on Cuba in view of the missile bases now being established there under the Soviet Union auspices.

In this special address, the President noted that no military cargo will be permitted to enter Cuba aboard any ship entering the Western Hemisphere. The President further stated that any action taken by the Soviet or Cuban Governments against any nation in the Western Hemisphere will be considered as an act of aggression against the United States.

## WAGE INCREASE FOR OTHER DISTRICTS

High Commissioner M. W. Goding announced yesterday that a wage increase for Micronesian employees in the other districts would be instituted --effective at the end of the first pay period in October. This wage increase is being made in order to bring the wage scales in the other districts more in line with that of the present Mariana Islands District wage scales.

The "C" Schedule level change, affecting all districts, will also be initiated in the near future. Details on the amount of increase and method of implementation are now being worked out by the Personnel and Finance Offices.
