VAN CAMP CANCELS VISIT TO SAIPAN

According to Special Assistant Jos. Flakne, who just returned last Saturday from a trip to Palau, Mr. and Mrs. Van Camp, who were originally scheduled to visit Saipan and confer with High Commissioner M. W. Goding, have cancelled their trip here. The visit was called off after the Van Camps learned of High Commissioner's sudden departure for Washington, D.C., to attend the 1964 budget hearings.

High Commissioner Goding and the Van Camps departed Friday night for U. S. mainland aboard the same plane. After a few days in California, Mr. Van Camp will probably fly to Washington, D.C. where he will confer with High Commissioner Goding on the proposed commercial fisheries in Palau.

Mr. Flakne further noted that although the Van Camps didn't see any fish in the deep Palau waters, they were very pleased during the whole trip.

de JONGH TO HEAD INSULAR DIVISION

NEW FLIGHT SCHEDULE

Effective November 5, 1962 (a week from Today), our SA-16 and DC-4 planes will operate according to the following new schedule:

- MONDAY - DC-4 from Guam to Saipan, returning to Guam via Rota.
SA-16 returning to Guam from Truk.
- TUESDAY - SA-16 departing Guam for Yap and Palau, and returning WEDNESDAY same route in reverse.
- THURSDAY - DC-4 departs Guam for Saipan via Rota, and returning to Guam directly.
- FRIDAY - SA-16 departs Guam for Truk and Ponape (over-night stay in Ponape).
- SATURDAY - SA-16 departs Ponape for Majuro via Kwajalein.
DC-4 to Saipan and back to Guam.
- SUNDAY - SA-16 departs Majuro for Truk via Kwajalein and Ponape, and stay over-night before departing Monday for Guam.

In addition, the DC-4 is scheduled to fly on the 1st and 3rd Tuesdays of every month to Angaur in Palau and Truk, respectively.

PILOT PROJECTS IN

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

The first phase of the two community development pilot projects to be carried out this year will get underway on November 8 in Yap District, according to an announcement released by Deputy High Commissioner Jose A. Benitez. The two pilot projects, one an Economic Development Project in handicraft development for Angaur and Peleliu Islands in Palau District and the other a Sanitation and general Community Clean up Project for Ulithi Atoll in Yap District, will be directed by Community Development Wm. V. Vitarelli.

To initiate these projects, a general training session has been scheduled to open in Yap on November 8th, 1962. In attendance will be Dr. Wm. Vitarelli; Mr. Carl Dannis, Assistant Director of Sanitation Services for the Trust Territory; and the new Community Development Officers from Angaur, Peleliu and Ulithi Islands. Other personnel such as health aides, teachers, sanitarians, etc., on Yap are also welcome to attend the sessions. Mr. Dannis will conduct the technical instruction in sanitation methods, particularly for the Ulithi Community Development Officers.

The general training session will be followed by special sessions at the pilot project sites. Tentatively, the special session for Ulithi Atoll has been scheduled for the last week of November although firm scheduling is dependent upon field trip services to the outer islands.

The specialized training session for Angaur and Peleliu Islands will be conducted in Palau from December 10 to 14, 1962.
