"PALM" PLANTING PROGRAM PROGRESSING

Reports and records over the past year show that coconut planting program is gaining more and more momentum month after month. Considering Ponape District alone, we noted that during last October the Ponape farmers populated their fertile islands of Kusae and Ponape proper with more coconut seedlings than there are Yapse in the world. In a period of a year, these farmers have planted more than 90,000 seednuts: this figure is greater than the population figure of the entire Trust Territory. Also in Ponape, the soap-making project is progressing very well: 15,200 cans of lye have been distributed to various villagers. This will produce about 78,000 pounds of soap, a supply for a full year.
