ARRIVALS

Yesterday's DC-4 flight brought several District staff members from Guam as well as a number of visitors. Mr. Robert Halvorsen, District Administrator of Truk District, who missed the DistAd Conference due to illness, arrived for a few days consultation with Headquarters staff members on Truk District matters. Palau District Administrator Manuel Godinez, who was accompanied by his wife, also arrived for orientation prior to his departure for Palau. Also among the arrivals yesterday was Mrs. Ruth Furber, wife of the TT Chief Justice, returning from home leave.

POLITICAL SCIENTIST HERE ON

BRIEF VISIT

Dr. Harold Jacobson of the University of Michigan arrived yesterday for a brief visit to Saipan. Dr. Jacobson, who is with the Department of Political Science at the institution, is carrying out a research project concerning the United States, the United Nations and problems of colonialism. He has been on an extensive trip to Europe, Africa and Asia in connection with his research. He spent a day in Truk and came on a turnaround to Saipan prior to his return to the mainland.

CHIEF JUSTICE'S TEMPORARY OFFICE

Chief Justice Edward P. Furber, whose headquarters have been in Truk District for the past twelve years, is currently holding temporary office in Room No. 213 (Tel: No. 2174) on the second floor of the Headquarters Building pending completion of High Court offices and Court room facilities in the Marianas District Administration area.

Having just returned from home leave, he is now scheduled to depart Saipan on August 14 for Guam, en route to Yap District where he will conduct a sitting of the High Court.

SHREW PROJECT

Dr. Kyle R. Barbehenn of the Department of Agriculture, Guam, and his research assistant, Mr. Gil Dryden, who are working on a rodent control project in Guam, will be using Saipan to test possible effects shrew population has on rodents. Among hypothesis to be tested is whether an increasing shrew population suppresses rats by preying on the young. Dr. Barbehenn and Mr. Dryden expect to be in Saipan for several weeks later this month trapping rats and gathering data on the local shrew population.

MICRONESIAN CONSTRUCTION COMPANY

CHARTERED

The Attorney General's Office at the Headquarters reported that a new MICRONESIAN CONSTRUCTION COMPANY was formed by 13 residents of Saipan on August 1, 1962. It has a capitalization of \$20,000 divided into 1,000 shares having par value of \$20 each. There are a few construction businesses in the Trust Territory operated by individuals, but MICRONESIAN CONSTRUCTION COMPANY is the first incorporated construction company chartered by the High Commissioner. Its purposes are: to conduct business and construct buildings, to import and export goods, to supply business materials, to rent construction materials and equipments, and to engage in urban development.
