PUBLIC LAW NO. 20-67

AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, 3, 8, 9 and 12 of Public Law No. 20-42, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 20-54 and 20-64, in order to appropriate \$4,892,933 of additional funds from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2018, to amend certain section sub-titles, to change the allottee for a particular line item, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

24	(iii) Section $8(12)(a)$ — the allottee of these
25	funds shall be the President of the College of Micronesia-

2	(iv) Section 8(12)(e) through (h) - the allottee
3	of these funds shall be the Chief Justice of the respective

5	(v) Section $9(1)$ — the allottee of these funds

7	(vi) Section $9(16)(a)$ - the allottee of these
8	funds shall be the President of the Federated States of
9	Micronesia; EXCEPT THAT, for the share of funds from this
LO	line item for the Conservation Society in Chuuk, the
11	allottee shall be the Governor of the State of Chuuk, AND,
L2	for the share of funds from this line item for the
13	Conservation Society in Yap, the allottee shall be the
L 4	Governor of the State of Yap, AND, for the share of funds

L7	(vii) Section $9(16)(f)$ - the allottee of these
L8	funds shall be the Governor of the State of Yap.
L9	(3) Lapse date. The authority of the allottees to obligate

21	30, 2018; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that the funds appropriated
22	under section 9 of this act shall not lapse."
