# GOVERNMENT OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA

---

The Federated States of Micronesia is a Nation constitutionally incepted on May 10, 1979, with a constitution that provides for three separate branches of the National Government: Executive, Legislative and Judicial.

**THE LEGISLATIVE BRANCH – ARTICLE IX:** The primary mandate of the Legislative Branch is to enact laws of the Nation and under the Constitution, the legislative powers of the national government vested in the Congress. As such, the Congress of the FSM is a unicameral lawmaking Body of 14 Members: FOUR Members are elected at-large from each state on the basis of state equality to serve a 4-year term and from this pool of at-large Members is where the President and Vice President is elected. The TEN Members are apportioned per state population and elected to serve a 2-yr term. The Speaker is the head of the Congress and the Legislative Branch and of the FSM.

**THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH – ARTICLE X:** The Executive Branch is charged with the management and operations of the national government manage with the executive powers of the national government is vested in the President. The President is the Head of State and Head of Government for the Federated States of Micronesia. The President and the Vice President are elected by the Congress from the at-large Members to serve a four-year administrative term.

**THE JUDICIAL BRANCH – ARTICLE XI:** The Judicial Branch is mandated to interpret and define the laws of the Nation as the judicial powers of the national government is vested in the FSM Supreme Court. The FSM Supreme Court is the highest court of the Nation and is headed by the Chief Justice and not more than 5 associate Justices. The Justices of court are nominated by the President for a lifetime term and confirmed by the Congress. The current Justices of the FSM Supreme Court are:

The State Governments, under their Constitutions, are structurally similar, all utilizing three branches, Executive, Legislative and Judicial. Their organization and composition vary according to and specific to each of their Constitutions.

## **Organization of the Legislative Branch**

---

The Legislative Branch of the FSM National Government was created through Article IX of the FSM Constitution through which vested the Nation's legislative powers to the Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia.

The whole organization and proceedings of the Congress of the FSM is governed by the Rules of Procedures (ROP) with a leadership mechanism built in to ensure the successful execution of its mandated responsibilities. The Congress leadership is comprised of the Presiding Officers and the Standing Committees.

**PRESIDING OFFICERS:** The Presiding Officers are: the Speaker, the Vice Speaker and the Floor Leader. It is the duty of the Speaker, with the assistance of the Vice Speaker and the Floor Leader, to ensure that all matters brought before the Congress are addressed according to the needs of the people and in accordance with the FSM Constitution. The Speaker combines the institutional role of Presiding Officer and Administrative Head of the Legislative Branch of the Government of the Federated States of Micronesia.

**STANDING COMMITTEES:** The Standing Committees are the general working bodies of the Congress as prescribed by the ROP. As authorized by the Constitution, it is the duty of a committee to make diligent and careful investigation of all the facts and circumstances connected with any bill, resolution, or matter referred to it, relating to any subject within its jurisdiction. A committee is comprised of seven members with at least one from each of the states and a chairperson appointed by the Speaker. The current Standing Committees are:

1. Committee on Ways and Means
2. Committee on Judiciary and Governmental Affairs
3. Committee on Resources and Development
4. Committee on Health and Social Affairs
5. Committee on Education
6. Committee on External Affairs
7. Committee on Transportation and Communications
8. Special Committee on Climate Change and Environment

## The Honorable Aren B. Palik



At-Large (4-year)

SENATOR-ELECT PALIK, is the at-large, four-year Representative from Kosrae State to the Twenty Third Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia

He is the Ninth Vice President of the Nation as sworn in on September 13, 2022.

Palik entered the national arena in 2019 when he joined 21<sup>st</sup> Congress as the At-large, 4-year representative from his state of Kosrae and in two years later was elected to the Vice Presidency after the passing of its former occupant.

Palik's first stint in the national stage was as a delegate of the 3<sup>rd</sup> FSM Constitutional Convention in 2005. He has an extensive experience in civic services with an equally impressive backdrop in management. Palik's financial background spans over 15 years beginning as a Planner and Economist for his home state of Kosrae, to Vice President of FSM's Development Bank to President and Chief Executive Officer for the Micronesia region's Pacific Islands Development Bank.

Senator Palik is married to Mrs Adelita Abraham Palik and they have four children: Sonja, Ryan Lloyd and Jason.



## The Honorable Paliknoa K. Welly

SENATOR-ELECT WELLY, is the two-year Representative of Kosrae State to the Twenty Third Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia.

Welly joined the Congress in 2007 and has represented the state of Kosrae ever since. While in Congress, he held several key positions including Chairman of External Affairs, Vice Speaker and Chairman of the Kosrae delegation to Congress.

Welly was the valedictorian at Lelu Elementary School ('67) and Kosrae High School ('71). He obtained a Bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice from California State – Turlock, and also attended the U.S. International University – San Diego, where he enlisted in the United States Marine Corps.



## The Honorable Peter M. Christian

SENATOR-ELECT CHRISTIAN, is the at-large, four-year Representative of Pohnpei State to the Twenty Third Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia

On May 11, 2015, Christian was sworn in as the Eighth President of the Nation.

Christian is a career politician with over 40 years of service to the people of Pohnpei State and to the Nation as a whole. He began as an elected representative in the Pohnpei District Legislature, then as the youngest member elected to the First FSM Congress in 1979. Christian embodies the basis of public servant having spent most of his life in service to the Nation.

His background is a compendium of national moments and historical events from being the youngest elected member of the FSM Congress to one of its most senior returning members to Speaker of the Body and eventually to President of the Nation. He spearheaded the Exxon Mobile phase out and establishment of the Nation's own FSM Petroleum Corp and was Chief Negotiator for the amended Compact of Free Association of 2003, are among the many national roles he served.

Christian is married to Maurina Weilbacher and they have two children and blessed with a few more grandchildren.



## The Honorable Merlynn Abello-Alfonso, M.D.

SENATOR-ELECT ABELLO-ALFONSO, is the two-year Representative of Pohnpei State's Congressional Election District One, to the Twenty Third Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia. Pohnpei State's ED 1 is comprised of Kolonia Town and the municipalities of Sokehs, Sapwuahfik, Nukuoro and Kapingamarangi.

Abello-Alfonso is the second woman elected to the Congress and also brings a well-rounded background in the field of medical health. She established and operates the only private hospital in the state of Pohnpei and the Nation as a whole, providing both inpatient and outpatient services for the Nation.

With a Doctorate in Medicine ('90), Abello-Alfonso returned from school and spent the next 8 years working for the Pohnpei State hospital in various roles and responsibilities amassing medical awards and recognitions along the way. Parallel to her medical footsteps is her extensive role in the civic society

## The Honorable Quincy Lawrence

SENATOR-ELECT LAWRENCE, is the two-year Representative of Pohnpei State's Congressional Elections District Two, to the Twenty Third Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia. Pohnpei state's ED2 is comprised of the municipalities of Madolenihmw and Kitti.



## The Honorable Esmond B. Moses



ED Three (2-year)

SENATOR-ELECT MOSES, is Pohnpei State's Representative of Congressional Elections District Three, to the Twenty Third Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia. Pohnpei state's ED3 is comprised of the municipalities of Nett, U, Mwoakilloa and Pingelap.

Moses was first elected to the Nineteenth Congress in 2015, and re-elected in 2017 when he was seated as the Eighth Vice Speaker of the Congress and has maintained his role for the next two Bodies.

With an Economics degree backdrop, Moses built a solid foundation of experience in economics and finance with services from retail to banking institute to the Pohnpei Utilities Corporation and a three-year contract with the Asian Development Bank prior to his election to the Congress in 2015. His foray into the national arena was however earlier in 2001 as a Delegate of the 3<sup>rd</sup> FSM Constitutional Convention.

Parallel to his professional portfolio is an equally rich social and civic engagement, as a board member of the Pohnpei Port Authority, FSM Telecommunications board, among others.

Moses is married to Aileen Gallen Moses and they are blessed with four children.

## The Honorable Wesley W. Simina


SENATOR-ELECT SIMINA, is the State of Chuuk's at-large, four-year Representative to the Twenty Third Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia

Simina was first elected to the 17<sup>th</sup> Congress in 2011 and re-elected for the same in 2015 and seated by the 19<sup>th</sup> Congress as the Sixth Speaker of the Congress.

With a JD from William S. Richard School of Law, Hawaii ('88), Simina amassed an extensive legal background in public services from Directing Attorney for the FSM Public Defender offices in Chuuk and Kosrae, to Legislative Counsel of the Chuuk Legislature, to Attorney General of Chuuk State. In his private practice, Simina represented various corporations and non-governmental organizations.

Simina's first dip in the political arena was as Chuuk State's at-large Delegate to the 2011, 3<sup>rd</sup> FSM Constitutional Convention. In 2005, Simina successful ran for and was elected Governor of Chuuk State and was re-elected as Governor, in 2009. Halfway through his second term, Simina entered and won the 2011 Congress special elections and was seated to the 17<sup>th</sup> Congress as the at-large representative of the state of Chuuk and has since been re-elected to maintain his seat.

Simina is married to Mrs. Ancelly and they have eight children and blessed with a couple of grandchildren.



## The Honorable Florencio Singkoro Harper

SENATOR-ELECT HARPER, is the State of Chuuk's Representative of Congressional Election District (ED) 1, to the Twenty Third Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia. Chuuk State's ED 1 is comprised of the grouping of islands also known as the Mortlocks region. He was first elected to the 17<sup>th</sup> Congress in 2011 where he was seated as the Floor Leader and maintained his role in the subsequent bodies.

Harper has dedicated over 30 years of his life in public services from the state's health services to education. But he is most noted for his long tenure at the Chuuk Legislature, which started in 1982 when it was one house and remained a member through to its bicameral set up. Throughout his tenure in the state legislature, Harper ran the gamut of leadership having chaired and co-chaired the various legislative committees, to the holding all three roles of presiding officer from Floor Leader to Vice Speaker with his final three terms at the legislature as, Speaker of the House of Representative. In 2011 he ran entered the national elections and won the seat of Chuuk State representative of Congressional Election District One to the 17<sup>th</sup> Congress.

## **The Honorable Victor 'Vicki' Gouland**

SENATOR-ELECT GOULAND, is the State of Chuuk's Representative of Congressional Election District (ED) 2, to the Twenty Third Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia. He represents the Northern Namoneas islands comprised of Weno, AND WHERE ELSE.

Gouland joined the 18<sup>th</sup> Congress in 2013 and has since been re-elected to maintain his seat.

Prior to the Congress, Gouland was a member of the House of Representative in the Chuuk State Legislature ('01-'05). In 2013, Gouland was elected and seated as a member of the FSM Congress and as a new Congressman he held dual vice chairmanship of the Standing Committees on Transportation and Communications and also on Resources and Development, with membership on the Committee on External Affairs.

During the reorganization of the 19<sup>th</sup> Congress, Senator Gouland was appointed to Chair the Committee on Transportation and Communication, and has maintained the same role in the subsequent bodies. He was again entrusted to serve in the same capacity during the reorganization of the 22<sup>nd</sup> Congress.

He is married to Kiemena Gouland and they are blessed with several children and many grandchildren

## **The Honorable Perpetua S. Konman**

SENATOR-ELECT KONMAN, is the State of Chuuk's Representative of Congressional Election District (ED) 3, to the Twenty Third Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia. She represents Chuuk's ED 3, the islands known as the Southern Namoneas Region.

On December 13, 2021, Konman was seated in the 22<sup>nd</sup> Congress and wrote FSM history as the first woman elected to the FSM Congress. She brings a fresh view of the world to the Congress as a newcomer to politics. While she is new to politics, her background encompasses a wide gamut of public service in the medical field.

In 1996, Konman started her medical career as a graduate of the Pacific Basin medical Officer Training program and spent the next 7 years as a General Physician for Chuuk. In 2003, she enrolled at the Fiji School of Medicine and pursued and attained her Masters in Internal Medicine. Konman returned to Chuuk in 2009 and became the state's primary Medical Physician and Internist until her election to the 22<sup>nd</sup> FSM Congress in 2021.

Konman is a widow and has 6 lovely children.

## The Honorable Tiwiter Aritos

SENATOR-ELECT ARITOS, is the State of Chuuk's Representative of Congressional Election District (ED) Four to the Twenty Third Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia. He represents the group of islands known as the Faichuuk Region.

Aritos holds seniority in the Chuuk Delegation having been elected in 2003 to the 13<sup>th</sup> Congress and has since been re-elected to maintain his seat. During the 15<sup>th</sup> Congress, he took over the Chairman of the Chuuk Delegation and has since also maintained his role.

Following his Guam graduation in 1987, Aritos tried out the field of law enforcement with the Chuuk Public Safety then onto the banking field in 1992 where he spent 5 year with the Bank of FSM and finally in 1997 he entered the political arena. Aritos spent the next five years as a member of the Senate in the Chuuk State Legislature until his election to the national arena in 2003. Aside from the political arena, Aritos is known for his active role in the sports

Aritos is married to Mrs. Lydia James Aritos and they have six children.



## The Honorable Robson U. Romolow

SENATOR-ELECT ROMOLOW, is the State of Chuuk's Representative of Congressional Election District (ED) Three to the Twenty Third Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia. Chuuk's ED3 is the area known as the Northwest and Halls region.

He joined the 19th Congress in 2015, and re-elected to the subsequent Congresses. Prior to his seat in political arena, Romolow spent his college years devoted to studies in Politics Philosophy, Economics and International Relations. He began his tertiary education in 1999 at the Northwest Nazarene University in Idaho and continued at Eastern Oregon University in 2001.



ED Five (2-year)

In 2008, Senator Romolow joined the Department of Foreign Affairs as a Foreign Service Officer (FSO) for the Division of Asia- Pacific Africa and Multi-lateral Affairs (APAMA). Two years later he was assigned to assist the growing FSM population residing on Guam as an FSO at the FSM Consulate Office. Romolow served in Guam until his election to the Congress of the FSM in 2015.

He is married to Mrs. Restlyn D. Romolow and is the father to 4 boys and girls

**The Honorable Joseph J. Urusemal**



**At-Large (4-year)**

SENATOR-ELECT URUSEMAL, is the State of Yap's at-Large and four-year Representative to the Twenty Third Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia.

In 2003, was sworn in as the Sixth President of the Nation.

He is one of the senior Members of the Congress having joined the Fifth Congress in 1987 and re-elected to the subsequent Bodies. Over 30 35 years, he served his people as Congress' most seasoned parliamentarian having spent over 12 years as the Floor Leader. While in the Congress, he has chaired the Committee on Health, Education and Social Affairs, and a member of all the Standing Committee of the Congress. During the last

Body, he Chaired the Committee on Education.

Urusemal has an Administration of Justice degree from Rockhurst ('76) and began his work experience with the Department of Corrections in the U.S. following and returned to Yap and expanded his work experience at the Department of Education until his election to the Congress in 1987.

Urusemal is married to Olania Latileilam and they have four children and several grandchildren.



**The Honorable Isaac V. Figir**

SENATOR-ELECT FIGIR, is the State of Yap's two-year Representative to the Twenty Third Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia. A role he has maintained since his election the Third Congress in 1983 until today.


During the reorganization of the 15<sup>th</sup> Congress in 2007, Figir became the Fourth person elected to the Speakership of the National Body and maintained his role for two consecutive Congressional Bodies, until 2013.

Figir is currently the most senior Member of the Congress, having maintained his role consecutively since 1983. Figir holds a Master's in Education from the Southern Illinois University ('75) and utilized his educational background as a researcher for both the Micronesian Legislative Corporation (MLS) and for the Commission on the Future Political Status Transition of the Micronesian island. In 1979, Figir was elected as a member of the historic Commission that blazed the trail of sovereignty and independence for the Micronesian Islands, a prelude to his future career.
