As a safety measure, everyone is reminded to practice extreme caution in walking over moss or algae grown sidewalks and wet floors. Parents should take care to ensure that their children are properly instructed in this regard.

Here are two things individuals can do to prevent accidents: (1) Wet floors in homes caused by water seepage should be mopped dry as soon as possible. This is especially necessary in homes with small children. (2) Driveways and outside walking surfaces with algae growths, caused by rainy weather, should be scrubbed with soap and water using a scrub brush.
