GUAM DAILY NEWS BACK TO PRESS

An 8-page GUAM DAILY NEWS, dated December 1st, was received here last Saturday. Apparently, this was the first issue of the GUAM DAILY NEWS since Typhoon Karen devastated Guam a little more than two weeks ago. In this issue, Publisher Joseph Flores acknowledged the generous assistance of the Government of Guam, Navy and Air Force which enabled the GUAM DAILY NEWS to resume, though still on a limited basis, its publication earlier than originally expected.

GUERRERO SLATED FOR GUAM GOVERNORSHIP

The GUAM DAILY NEWS carried an article by George Spencer (DAILY NEWS Correspondent in Washington, D.C.) that Secretary Manuel Guerrero, who is now Acting Governor of Guam, is to be named for Guam Governorship soon, although final decision on the appointment has not yet been made by President Kennedy. However, Acting Governor Guerrero told the DAILY NEWS that he has not received as yet any official information regarding his appointment to succeed Bill Daniel.
