VAN CAMP PRESIDENT TO VISIT TTPI

Mr. Gilbert Van Camp, President of the Van Camp Corporation, and Mrs. Van Camp will be arriving in Guam shortly on the first leg of a two-week visit to Palau District. Mr. Van Camp will visit Saipan for a few days to confer with High Commissioner M. W. Goding on the proposed commercial fisheries development project the Van Camp Corporation has for the Palau District. During Mr. Van Camp's visit to Palau, he will personally conduct further investigations on the tuna fishery possibilities in that district.

COOP SEMINAR STARTS 3RD DAY

The second Cooperative Seminar, which opened preliminary sessions on Monday with only a fraction of the participants in attendance, finished its second day of preliminary discussions yesterday with high hopes that the remaining delegates would soon join them. For a time yesterday, it appeared that the DC-4 flight from the Marshalls and Truk would arrive in time to make a trip to Saipan later in the afternoon to discharge the Marshalls and Eastern Caroline delegates. By 1:00 p.m., however, the plane's schedule was such as to preclude this possibility. Thus, the advance group opened its third day of preliminary discussions with no hope of reinforcements until the Thursday flight.

High Commissioner M. W. Goding and Mr. Dwight Heine, Chairman of the COUNCIL OF MICRONESIA, presented a check for \$250 to Mr. Gonzalo Santos of Saipan this morning in a simple ceremony held in the High Commissioner's Office. The historic occasion was photographed for posterity by the Information Office, and appropriate press release on this momentous occasion will be released to the world press. Mr. Santos, when interviewed by the HQ reporter, stated that he intends to invest the amount with the Bank of America in Saipan.

As noted in Monday's issue, a consolation prize of \$50 for Enja Enos, a student from Jaluit Atoll, Marshalls, who submitted a similar design, was also awarded during the same ceremony. Mr. Dwight Heine, Chairman of Council, received the check for Mr. Enos.

THREE "DC-4 FLIGHTS" TOMORROW

Information was received just before press time that there will be two flights of Air Force DC-4 tomorrow to Saipan. The first flight will be in at about 10 a.m., bringing 11 Air Force personnel to work on the Isley Field Project; the second one will be in about 2:00 p.m. to pick up the Air Force crew back to Guam. Each will remain on ground for approximately twenty minutes.
